- Earn a certificate for employment and credits toward a college degree.
- Improve your English reading, writing and speaking skills.
- Study in college-level classes while enrolled in English as a Second Language (ESL) or Adult Basic Education (ABE).

I-BEST SHORT-TERM CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS

Nursing Assistant Certified I-BEST

Certificate, 2 quarters, 12 credits.

- The Nursing Assistant Certified program is for you if you like to help people, enjoy working in a team, and are comfortable giving personal care to patients.
- You will study basic nursing care skills, which include First Aid, CPR, and HIV/AIDS and get valuable clinical experience in a long-term care facility.
- At the end of the program, you will be prepared to take the Washington State Assistant Nursing Exam to become a Certified Nursing Assistant.
- You must be able to pass a Washington State background check in order to work as a nursing assistant.

JOBS: available in nursing and residential care facilities, clinics, hospitals, and home-health care services.

Early Childhood Education I-BEST

Child Development Associate Certificate

Certificate, 3-4 quarters, 12 credits.

Enroll any quarter. Classes are in the evening.

- The Childhood Development Associate program is for you if you enjoy helping children grow, learn, and gain new skills.
- Get a Childhood Development Associate certificate while you improve your English skills. You will take classes in Child & Family Studies and additional ESL or ABE support classes.
- At the end of the program, you can transfer your 12 credits to an Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree in Social and Human Studies.
- You must be able to pass a Washington State background check to work in childcare.

JOBS: Childcare workers, and assistant or preschool teachers.

Microsoft Office Applications – I-BEST Information Technology for ESL Students

Certificate, 1-3 quarters, 15 credits.

Enroll in fall, winter, or spring quarter.

- The Information Technology program is for you if you want to learn computer skills in college-level classes and improve your English.
- You will earn Microsoft Application Certificates in PowerPoint, Word, and Excel.
- Areas of study include Microsoft Office, PowerPoint, Word, Excel, and Microsoft Certification Test Preparation.
- At the end of the program, you can transfer your 15 credits to the Applications Support Certificate program or an A.A.S. degree.

JOBS: Healthcare support, data entry, finance, software, travel, and hospitality.

OPPORTUNITY GRANTS

All I-BEST programs qualify for Opportunity Grants.

To qualify, you must be a Washington resident and meet the low income requirements. You must apply for financial aid and maintain a 2.0 GPA.
